



## Betar Australia COVID Guidelines

By signing up for Betar Summer camps or attending any Betar event you agree to the following guidelines:

### Vaccination:

- All of Betar Australia's staff will be fully vaccinated
- We require **all Chanichim (participants) above the age of 16 to be fully vaccinated** at least two weeks prior to the beginning of their camp, as well as if they are attending any Betar activities prior to camp. Their vaccination certificate needs to be sent to Betar prior to the first activity attended.
- We **strongly encourage all Chanichim above the age of 12 to be fully vaccinated**. Currently this is a recommendation only; however, we envision this is likely to change prior to Betar Fed Camp (mid Jan 2022) so please take this into account when signing up for camp. Mandates will be updated in line with government roadmaps/respective State Government advice.

### Reasons not to attend camp/activities:

- Please do not send your child on camp/any Betar activity if they have any COVID-like symptoms or if anyone in your household has been to an exposure site, is waiting on test results or is required to be in self-isolation
- Please notify us if anyone in your household has returned from overseas in the two weeks prior to camp so we can discuss further
- If your child misses part of camp due to the above reasons, a partial refund will be provided

### Testing:

- All camp attendees (staff and Chanichim) will have to present a negative test result, taken up to 72 hours prior to camp
- Betar may require staff or Chanichim to get tested during camp if they present with symptoms; if this is the case, Betar will utilise rapid tests or drive the symptomatic person to a testing clinic

### Pick up in case of a positive case on Betar camps:

- If your child tests positive, you will be asked to immediately pick them up. If the camp does not take place in your state, Betar will support you and your child
- If a Chanich/a or staff member tests positive, all camp attendees may be considered close contacts. In that case we would urge you to come pick up your child, again providing support for parents who are unable to do so

We are aware this may pose a challenge to you and your family in these difficult circumstances. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you would like to discuss anything further. Vaccination exemptions will be approved in the same way the vaccination certificates are, through the Australian Immunisation Register.
